

## Crochet Flower Necklace cum Bracelet



A crocheted flower necklace in lame silver thread which can double up as a bracelet. The necklace is simple to make and takes less than an hour from start to finish. It is a great project for small amounts of leftover yarn.






### Materials:

- 4 ply lame silver thread (or any leftover yarn)
- 3.5mm / 4.0mm crochet hook
- metal clasp / fastener
- 6 small pearl beads / shiny beads
- gray thread for sewing
- embroidery needle

### Abbreviations:

ch = chain  
dc = double crochet (American)  
rep = repeat

<u>Step</u>	<u>Method</u>	
1.	<p>1<sup>st</sup> Flower: Make a flower by using any of the following tutorials or written pattern:</p> <p><a href="http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=92fsuYTAa0U">http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=92fsuYTAa0U</a>  <a href="http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=X9MgRpT5fyM">http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=X9MgRpT5fyM</a>  <a href="http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=L40GldH0Rn0">http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=L40GldH0Rn0</a></p> <p><u>Written Pattern of the 5 petal flower:</u>            Magic Circle            *Ch 2, dc 2 times into the magic circle, ch2, slip stitch into the magic circle            Rep from * to make 4 more petals.</p> <p>Do not cut the yarn.            Chain 10.</p>	
2.	<p>2<sup>nd</sup> Flower:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Chain 2 for the first part of the flower petal.</li> <li>2. Counting from the hook, use the 3<sup>rd</sup> chain from the hook as your magic circle and crochet the 2<sup>nd</sup> flower. (Remember you have already completed chain 2 of the first petal).</li> <li>3. Chain 10.</li> </ol>	

3.	Repeat step 2 until you have completed 6 flowers.	
4.	<b>For Necklace</b> - continue with ch stitches until your necklace is of the desired length.	
5.	<b>For Bracelet</b> - ch until your bracelet can be wrapped around your wrist 3 times.	
6.	Fasten off	
7.	Attach one end of the fastener behind the first flower and the other at the end of the chain.	
8.	Using some gray thread, sew the flowers into place on your necklace so that the flowers lay flat and sew a pearl or shiny bead in the middle of the flower to embellish. Your necklace/bracelet is now finished.	 <p data-bbox="228 1171 579 1283">Figure 1: Reverse Side: Lay the chain over the flower and sew the chain into place on the back of the flower.</p> <p data-bbox="675 1171 1026 1261">Figure 1: Front Side - sew a pearl or shiny bead in the middle of the flower with grey thread.</p> <p data-bbox="1082 1171 1430 1227">Figure 3: Front Side - bead secured.</p>
***	This is a <b>variation</b> using some leftover green yarn.	 <p data-bbox="587 1391 1430 1581">Crochet a flower and then continue doing chain stitches until you can wrap the bracelet around your wrist two times. Ch10 fasten off and cut yarn. Make a loop by counting 10 ch from the end and sew the last chain into the 11<sup>th</sup> ch from the end securely. Cut yarn. To fasten the bracelet – loop over the flower.</p>
